PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

It is an honor for me to address the members of the Florida Entomological Society (FES) as President. I have been a member of the FES since 1989, when I was an undergraduate studying at the Florida A&M University. The FES is an important organization as it fosters an entomological research network composed of professionals from academia, industry, and government agencies. The training that I have received over the past three years has prepared me to lead this organization for the next year. I have obtained substantial briefings from the Past President, Rob Meagher. In addition, I have reviewed the Society's operating guidelines so that I can become more familiar with my duties as President, as well as the routine operations of the Society.

As President, I would like to thank everyone that volunteered and contributed their time to making the 91st annual meeting this past July in Jupiter, Florida, a success. We had four great symposia with excellent speakers. In addition, there were many competitive student presentations. Thank you to the leadership of our Past President, Rob Meagher, as well as the support of our President-Elect, Scott Ferguson, who ensured that all of the presentations, electronic visual aids, and poster boards were facilitated. Although the attendance number at the Jupiter meeting was lower than in the past, the contributing factors for this were beyond our control. There were other meetings that conflicted with our meeting dates, including the Car-

ibbean Food Crops Society meeting in Miami and the International Congress of Entomology meeting in South Africa.

For the next 12 months, I would like to focus on four objectives. First, I would like to continue pursuing a goal Rob Meagher initiated: making sure that all committees have active members and are carrying out the responsibilities of their respective committees. Second, I would like to fill vacant committees, including our Fiscal Committee, which has remained vacant for some time. Third, I would like to encourage all students from institutions within the state of Florida, to play a more participatory role in the Society's affairs. Therefore, we will have a broad students' representation at the executive board meetings. Finally, I am asking members of the Long-Range Planning and Caribbean Conference Committees to work together towards developing a stronger relationship with other entomological or related societies in the region, such as the Southern Lepidopterists' Society or the Caribbean Food Crops Society. The goal is to have a joint meeting at some future date, as well as to hold a Caribbean Conference as we have had in the past.

Plans are in action to host our 2009 annual meeting on Sunday July 26-29, 2009 at the Sanibel Harbor Resort and Spa in Fort Myers, Florida. As the date gets closer, we will be making final arrangements and updating you with symposia, workshops, and general presentations.

Business Report (Teresa DuChene, Rob Meagher reporting): Due to a post office problem, backlog issues of the Florida Entomologist were sent late.

Honors & Awards (Chris Tipping): More participation in nominating individuals for honors and awards is needed.

Membership (Michael Franks): There are currently 3 corporate members, 233 full members, 27 student members, and 8 sustaining members. All categories are down. More membership committee members are needed.

1) Entomologist of the year is **Oscar Liburd** for his research programs involving small fruit production as well as his extension efforts.

2) Annual Achievement Award for Teaching in Higher Education is awarded to **Dan Hahn** for his for his excellence in teaching undergraduate honors and graduate courses in insect physiology at the University of Florida's Entomology and Nematology Department in Gainesville.

3) Annual Achievement Award for Teaching in K-12 is awarded **Rebecca Baldwin** for her work with high school teachers involving the use of insects in the classroom as well as her involvement in school IPM programs and 4H clubs.

4) Annual Achievement Award for Research goes to **Stuart Reitz** for his innovative research in the creation of IPM programs to control thrips, diamond back moth, and yellow-margined leaf beetle. Stuart is also Co-Director for the Center for Biological Control and an Adjunct Associate Professor at Florida A&M University.

5) Annual Achievement Award for Extension winner is **Jennifer L. Gillett**. Jennifer serves as the UF, IFAS IPM Program Associate Director. She conducts seminars, lectures, and workshops for Extension in-service training and is responsible for the creation and maintenance of the Florida IPM website.

6) Annual Achievement Award for Industry is awarded to **Tim Gast** for his contributions in the fight against the Asian citrus psyllid and citrus greening disease in Florida.

7) Annual Achievement Award for Research Teams is presented to **David G. Hall, Carl C. Childers, and Joseph E. Eger** for creating formal sampling procedures for detecting and estimating citrus rust mite population densities on fruit in citrus trees. They have researchers that developed a grower friendly database that produces sampling guidelines for research investigations and commercial scouting programs.
